

Where I live

Geography

Our context this half term will be about 'Where I live'. The children will learn lots of Geographical skills in this unit. The children will use a simple maps to locate places such as Spinney Hill Park.



The first unit of our scheme of work is called Being Me. The children will learn about how their views are important and what is special



This half term children will be exploring what Muslims and Christians believe in.



Computing

The children will learn how to switch on a laptop and develop their skills in using a keyboard and a mouse.



During art lessons children will be learning different drawing and painting skills. They will also learn about colours and colour mixing.



In music this half term the children will be learning about pulse. The children will learn to identify the difference between long and short sounds and be able to follow musical directions by playing faster and slower.



Phonics

- Children will be revisiting phase 2 from foundation stage to make sure their knowledge is secure before moving on to the next phase.
- Regular daily phonics sessions will ensure your child will be able to develop their reading skills.

Reading

- Children will be using their knowledge of phonics to read simple sentences
- They will be able to read some common irregular words.

Writing

Use their phonic knowledge to write words and begin to form sentences.

In Maths, we will be focussing on:

- Number and place value ensuring that children can count objects up to 20, order them and be able to say which number is one more or one less
- Adding and subtracting single digit numbers.
- Solving problems including addition and subtraction.

Science

We will be learning about Animals including Humans. The children will learn how to group animals together. They will also learn about the names of their body parts and their senses and have a go at using their senses. Towards the end of the term children will start to learn about Autumn by observing how the outside world changes. Children will also have an opportunity to look at the weather and notice how it is different to the rest of the year.
